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Unfortunately, all three beliefs are rooted more in conventional wisdom and political sloganeering than in strong empirical research. I realized then, that in order to teach French well, I needed to develop relationships with students and show them that I cared about them as people. Our research suggests that there is some truth to the predominant ideology. Greater personal control may also lead to healthier behaviors, partly by increasing social capital. Although our research does not tackle the complex social and political aspects of the tenure debate, our results in New York City clearly come down on the side of teacher experience, showing that greater tenure in the classroom leads to higher student achievement gains. Our research shows that social capital is also at work in schools. An enthusiastic, overflow crowd of nearly 2,000 parents, grandparents, and other well-wishers filled the church that day to cheer the achievers.
